



### Botox anti-wrinkle injectables

- Anti-wrinkle injectables are made from drug called Botulinum Toxin.
  - Botulinum Toxin is FDA approved for over 20 years with no known adverse effects.
  - Botulinum Toxin is used for both medical and cosmetic treatments.
- Side effects :
- some clients may report mild bruising
  - approximately 1-3%- experience temporary 'droopy eyelid'
  - All side effects can be corrected or will fade in time.
  - To reduce the risk of complications it is
- Botulinum Toxin or anti-wrinkle injectables should be administered by highly qualified practitioners in a safe and medical environment.

### Will I be able to move my face

- Of course! The 'frozen' look many of us associate with anti-wrinkle injectables is only caused when too much toxin is administered into one area.
- Skin practitioners target small specific muscles that are responsible for unwanted lines and wrinkles only.
- Normal facial expressions such as smiling, frowning or looking surprised is preserved in good skilled and trained hands.
- During consultation your practitioner will talk you through the treatment and use subtle effects so no one need to know your secret.

### How does it work

- Anti-wrinkle injectables are a natural protein that works by interrupting this process of creasing in the skin.
- Facial movement such as squinting and frowning can cause lines and wrinkles of small muscles of face which eventually become permanent lines and wrinkles.

### Do anti-wrinkle injectables really prevent ageing?

- Evidence suggests that if used regularly, anti-wrinkle injectable can delay and prevent the signs of ageing.
- Botulinum toxin restricts facial muscle movement which means signs of ageing can be prevented.

### What areas can be treated with anti-wrinkle injectable

- Anti-wrinkle injectables are mainly used for the face.
- Forehead wrinkles, crow's feet lines, around the eyes, and the '11 lines' between the eyebrows are most popular areas
- decreasing the 'orange peel' appearance of the chin
- lifting the corners of the mouth.

### What happens after treatment

- You can carry on with your day as normal immediately after leaving the beauty salon,
- it's important to avoid anything strenuous for 24 hours such as going to the gym.
- Side effects are rare, but occasionally some clients experience bruising, but this usually fades quickly.
- Make sure you are using high SPF sun cream to protect your skin from sun damage.
